To fulfill our mission, TENN-SHARE has focused on the following activities this year:

Advocacy

TENN-SHARE followed up its success in helping to secure state funding for *TEL*, the *Tennessee Electronic Library*, by honoring those legislators who were most helpful in the passage of the appropriations bill providing recurring funding for *TEL*. Eight State Representatives and four State Senators were invited to the TENN-SHARE Fall Conference so they could be thanked in person for their efforts on *TEL*'s behalf. Representatives John Hood, Kent Coleman and Beth Harwell attended, and Rep. Joe Armstrong sent his legislative assistant, LaTonya Ellis in his place. Senator Diane Black attended and Senator Jim Kyle's legislative assistant, Lauren Agee, represented him.

Secretary of State Riley Darnel, State Librarian Jeanne Sugg and TENN-SHARE lobbyist Nathan Ridley were also honored.

Those legislators unable to attend the conference were honored in ceremonies in their local libraries: Rep. Steve McDaniel in a presentation by Dinah Harris at the Everett Horn Public Library in Lexington; Rep. Doug Overbey at the Blount County Public Library in Maryville in a presentation by Kathy Pagles; Rep. Phil Pinion in a presentation at the University of Tennessee at Martin by Susan Blakely and Mary Carpenter; Sen. Randy McNally at the Oak Ridge Public Library and Sen. Rosalind Kurita at the Clarksville-Montgomery County Public Library.

DataFest: (report by DeAnne Luck)

The 2007 DataFest was revamped a bit this year. We did away with the longer "subject sessions," instead scheduling sessions in 25-minute individual blocks. We did still schedule subjects together to keep the idea of providing a comparison of similar products. We had four sessions in the morning, from 10:00-12:10, and five in the afternoon, 1:30-4:10. TENN-SHARE Fall Conference:

After the Welcome by TENN-SHARE President Suresh Ponnappa, the Conference began with recognition of key State Legislators influential in helping obtain state funding for *TEL*. Please see “Advocacy” above.

Then, TENN-SHARE’s Strategic Planning Committee Co-chairs, Judy Drescher, Memphis Public Library & Information Center and Nancy Renfro, Watauga Regional Library, presented the **TENN-SHARE Strategic Plan 2008 – 2010** to the membership. Each of the three Strategic Goals were then discussed in breakout sessions with facilitators:

- Goal #1 – DeAnne Luck, TENN-SHARE and Suresh Ponnappa, ETSU
 - TENN-SHARE will strengthen dialogue with fifteen organizations to collaborate on achieving common goals over the next three years.
- Goal #2 – Judy Drescher and Nancy Renfro
 - TENN-SHARE will increase our financial resources annually over the next three years to strengthen and expand our services and operations.
- Goal #3 – Gayle Baker, UTK and Chris Ryan, UTC
 - TENN-SHARE will develop and implement a three-year marketing campaign to inform our members and other agencies of who we are and what we do.

“**Expanding *TEL* To a True Statewide Network**” was the topic of the afternoon session. It began with the panel “**What is a “Statewide Network”?**” moderated by Melissa Brenneman, Knox Co Public Library and composed of

Breakout reports and a wrap-up by President Ponnappa completed the very successful day.

TASL Conference:

TENN-SHARE sponsored three programs at the Tennessee Association of School Librarians Conference in Franklin:

1. A "Mini-DataFest" held during the Exhibitors Reception on Thursday evening and presented by DeAnne Luck, TENN-SHARE Database Coordinator, included demonstrations from *World Book Online Kids and Advanced*; *Teen Health & Wellness: Real Life, Real Answers*; *TeachingBooks.net*; and *Britannica Online School Edition*.
2. *The Growth of Democracy in Tennessee: A Grass-roots Approach to Volunteer Voices*, presented by Tiffani Conner and Nancy Kemp, gave examples of how teachers and librarians can use primary resources – found in *Volunteer Voices* (www.volunteervoices.org) – in the classroom.
3. *InfoToGo: A New Kind of Interlibrary Loan*, presented by David Atkins, UTK, and Connie Booher, Knox County Schools.

TLA Conference:

TENN-SHARE sponsored these programs at the TLA Conference in Kingsport.

TENN-SHARE and *Volunteer Voices* shared a booth in the exhibits area of the Conference with materials available on this digitization project overseen by Tiffani Conner, UTK. In addition there was information on participating in group subscriptions through TENN-SHARE, as well as information on joining our organization. Also there was information on *InfoToGo*, the One-Step Access Interlibrary Loan project overseen by David Atkins at UTK with help from Jack Stacy at the State Library and Connie Booher at Knox County Public Schools.

Electronic Resource Sharing (Report by DeAnne Luck)

The TENN-SHARE Database Coordinator, DeAnne Luck, increased her hours to 10 per week this year, organizing trials, administering group purchases, and publicizing information to members. The main vehicle for member communication is the bi-weekly *Database News & Offers* newsletter, which is both emailed and available on the website.

Free trials of many other databases were also provided. Most of these offered discounts to TENN-SHARE members, and the libraries ordered directly from the vendor.

The number of group purchases made by member libraries reached 171 this year. Although it is not possible to calculate the exact savings enjoyed by every library in every purchase, the following four examples show how much can be achieved by working together:

STAT!Ref Medical eBooks:
Average savings per library \$6,250 17 libraries = total savings \$106,250

STAT!Ref Nursing eBooks:
Average savings per library \$911 24 libraries = \$21,864

STAT!Ref Anatomy TV:

Average savings per library \$1,578 14 libraries = \$22,092

OCLC WorldCat:

Average savings per library \$7,869 56 libraries = \$440,680

The addition of OCLC WorldCat has benefits to the library community as a whole in addition to the actual subscribers. Worldcat.org can be searched for free by anyone, and Tennessee is well on the way to a statewide catalog for academic libraries.

Membership

Once again the TENN-SHARE membership record was broken, with an all-time high of 588 members. Sixty-five academic, 117 public, 375 school and 31 special libraries joined TENN-SHARE this year.
