STAT!Ref Medical eBooks:

- \$6,250 x 18 libraries = \$112,500

STAT!Ref Nursing eBooks:

- \$911 x 28 libraries = \$25,508

STAT!Ref Anatomy TV:

- \$1,578 x 15 libraries = \$23,670

OCLC WorldCat:

- \$7,869 x 56 libraries = \$440,664

Total Savings = \$602,342
